## **5 SOUTH AFRICAN RECORD REGULATIONS**

### **5.1 GENERAL RULES**

- a Skiers licensed as competitive skiers with other Federations are not eligible to set any SA or Provincial records, but may set "all-comers" records.
- b South African National records will be recognised from performances achieved at **Standing List** and **Limited Standing List** as defined in Section 9.
- c Any performance exceeding the existing Region EAME or World record will not be accepted as a South African record unless it was performed at a Record Capability competition and the record is accepted by the Region EAME or World Tournament Council.
- d If a skier breaks a record it is up to that skier to inform South African Water Ski of the performance.
- e Should a Bambino, Dauphin or Junior skier compete in an older age category or open competition, the performance will count for South African record purposes as the category in which he/she competed and not his/her actual age category.
- f Should a Senior skier compete in a younger age category or open competition, the performance will count for South African record purposes as the category in which he/she competed and not his/her actual age category.
- g An International, National or Inter-Provincial tournament will not be eligible for the setting of any provincial records.

### **5.2 VERIFICATION OF SA RECORDS**

For a performance to be recognised as a new SA Record, the following procedure must be followed:

- The Chief Judge or the Organiser may apply to the Tournament Committee for a record performance to be ratified. The following documentation is required:
  - Application must be made within a period of 3 months.
  - Copy of the homologation results (hard copy or digital format).
  - Judges panel.
  - Recorded boat time (for Slalom and Ramp).
  - Video jump data (jump setting, picture of jump)
  - Actual trick runs in questions (must have been recorded on a video camera in VHS format) which must be reviewed by a panel of the Technical Committees choice for verification.

Although the record verification cannot change the score recorded in the tournament, the score may be changed for record acceptance

### **5.3 VIDEO REVIEW**

A skier or his representative will be entitled to request that the Technical Committee review the video of a trick performance, if the total score of the actual tricks performed would have exceeded a current National Record, prior to disallowance's.

## **SECTION 3 - SOUTH AFRICAN SUPPLEMENTARY TECHNICAL REGULATIONS**

Wherever feasible the current International Water Ski Federation Technical Rules and any amendments applicable to Region EAME (Europe, Africa and the Middle East) will apply at all South African Tournament Criteria Calendar competitions, except as amended in the following South African Tournament Criteria Rules.

South African Water Federation and Tournament Criteria Rules concerning competitor behaviour, official's behaviour and Doping Rules apply to all persons taking part in Tournament water skiing. Copies of these rules are available and are published on the South African Water Ski Web pages

### **6 COMPETITION REGULATIONS**

#### **6.1 INTERPRETATION OF THE RULES**

Interpretations of the rules should be referred to the Technical Committee when possible. In the interest of expediency, the Chief Judge, after discussion with his panel, may give his own interpretation which shall be binding until the Technical Committee has been polled. This shall serve however, only as a temporary interpretation until the question has been referred to the entire Committee. Such a poll shall take place as promptly and in the most practical manner as possible.

#### **6.2 ROUNDS**

Each event shall consist of two rounds: A first round and a second round. All skiers qualified to ski in an event must ski in the first round of that event.

#### **6.3 FAMILIARISATION**

Familiarisation (official practice) shall be offered by the tournament organiser under the authority and responsibility of the Chief Judge based on the principle that each skier shall receive an equal opportunity for familiarisation.

#### **6.4 SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT EVENT SCORING**

Each contestant's score for both the first and second rounds shall be totalled to yield his total score for determining placement in the event

Slalom: The skier will be credited with the number of buoys effectively passed (from 0 to 6). Six buoys will be added to the results of the competitor for each pass between the actual starting speed and the minimum starting speed as defined for the particular category as long as the first pass is successful

Tricks: The sum of the two passes.

Jump: The longest jump of each round.

#### **6.5 SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT OVERALL SCORING**

The better result in either the first or second rounds will be counted towards calculating overall.

The following amendment will be used at all national competitions and is recommended for all other competitions:-

Competition for the three major events shall be separated into the following divisions as determined by the contestant's age as at midnight of **31 December** prior to the Tournament.

Ladies	25 - 34 years old inclusive	} are at 31 December

During any one competition, any skier competing in a particular division may not ski in any other division.

**NOTE:**

South African Tournament Criteria recommends that before moving to a 1.65 metre ramp, women are at least 17 years of age and capable of jumping at least 30 metres off a 1.5 metre ramp.

South African Tournament Criteria recommends that before moving to a 1.80 metre ramp, men are at least 17 years of age and capable of jumping at least 45 metres off a 1.65 metre ramp.

The following restrictions shall apply to Bambino Girls and Bambino Boys division:

- the boat path will be between the ramp and the 15 metre buoys of the jump course
- at no time may the skier cross the boat wake during the approach to the ramp

**9.2 GENERAL JUMP CONDITIONS**

In the event of a delay of 10 minutes or more between a skiers jumps, a free warm-up jump will be offered to the skier.

Men	58 kph
Women Open	55 kph
Men Open	58 kph
Senior Men I / II / III	55 kph
Senior Men IV	52 kph
Senior Women I / II / III	55 kph
Senior Women IV	52 kph

### 10.3 SPECIAL SLALOM OPTION FOR SENIOR 4 SKIERS

Senior 4 men and women may opt to shorten at 52 kph in which case 16m @ 52 kph will be treated as 55 kph and so on for scoring purposes.

### 10.4 GENERAL SLALOM CONDITIONS

In the event of a delay of 10 minutes or more between a skiers passes, a free warm-up pass will be offered to the skier. The skier may not fall, but had a protected score.

### 10.5 SCORING

EVENT: The skier will be credited with the number of buoys effectively passed from the minimum starting speed as defined for the particular category (Rule 10.2) as long as the first pass is successful.

OVERALL: The skier will be credited with the number of buoys effectively passed from the base speed of 34 km/h as long as the first pass is successful.

## 11 TRICKS – SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT COMPETITION REGULATIONS

### 11.1 TRICKS LIST

A list of declared tricks to be attempted by the skier may be required from each entrant in the trick event before the event starts. This decision will be made by the CHIEF JUDGE prior to the start of the competition, and could apply to only certain specified categories or certain specified skiers or both or to all skiers in all categories.

## **12 REGION EAME VARIATION FROM WORLD RULES**

The IWSF Region EAME Additional Rules make variations from the IWSF Technical Rules (World Rules). Unless otherwise stated in these South African Water Ski Additional Rules the variations apply to all competitions in South Africa

### **12.1 FALL IN JUMPING**

The following guidance is given to Judges and Safety Directors. (As the suggested actions are not covered by the IWSF Rules they can only be taken at South African Water Ski competitions).

If a skier falls and states within 3 minutes that he wishes to continue, but the boat judge reports that he thinks the skier may be injured:-

- a If there is no officially appointed Doctor immediately available - the Safety Director/Event Judge should not allow the skier to jump again. See IWSF Rule 7.05.
- b If an officially appointed Doctor is immediately available - the Safety Director / Chief Judge should stop the competition for long enough for the Doctor to examine the skier and report (see IWSF Rules 7.01 and 7.02). If the delay causes problems for the completion of the competition the next competitor (s) should ski whilst the skier is being examined.

If the Doctor then reports that the skier is not injured and would have been in a fit condition to ski within 3 minutes he should be allowed to take his other jump.

If the Doctor reports that the skier would not have been in a fit condition to ski within the 3 minutes, he should not be allowed to jump again (even if, by the end of the examination he is in a fit condition to jump again).

### **12.2 SAFETY HELMETS**

In accordance with the IWSF Rules it is mandatory at all Competitions to wear a Safety helmet in the jump event.

The helmet should have a chin strap that cannot slip around the neck yet it must be able to be undone quickly. Any water that enters the helmet must be able to get out very quickly.

### **12.3 HANDLE RECOIL DEVICES**

For all competitions, a handle recoil device (i.e. shock tube) is mandatory for the slalom event. When a slalom switch is in use the shock tube must be fitted to cover the carabina clip. You may need to modify existing shock tubes to cover the carabina.

### **12.4 BOAT TIMING**

When speed control is in, use the World rules apply. When automatic timing is used the judge should have a separate display available to see the times for each pass.

If manual timing has to be used - after each pass the boat timer must show the watch to the boat judge and times must be written down or passed to the shore by radio.

In the event that the boat judge is not shown the times on the watch (either hand or auto timing) the skier will receive a mandatory re-ride.

**12.5 ALCOHOL**

Officials are reminded that alcohol can impair performance and judgement. They should be mindful of this for the duration of a competition.

**12.6 OFFICIAL PUNCTUALITY**

Officials shall attend any meetings called by the Chief Judge unless specifically excused, and shall be in their positions at least 10 minutes before the start of each event.

Appointed drivers shall arrive on site in adequate time before the scheduled start time of familiarisation.

## SECTION 4 – TOURNAMENT ORGANISER RESPONSABILITIES

### 13 SOUTH AFRICAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

#### Chief Judge / Appointed Officials

The Tournament Council will appoint and invite the Chief Judge, Homologator, Calculator, Judge Panel, Chief Driver and Drivers. The Tournament Council will ensure that enough officials are available to run the Championships as a Standing List competition.

The Tournament Organiser will assist with transport and accommodation if required.

#### Homologation

The site installations for slalom and jump must have been checked and certified by a qualified Homologator as complying with minimum **Standing List Homologation** (as section 9 – Homologation Levels). A copy of the computer print out must be sent to the Tournament Committee at least a week prior to the competition

### 14 NATIONAL LEG CALENDAR COMPETITIONS

#### Chief Judge / Appointed Officials

The Tournament Council will prepare a list of officials available to officiate as Chief Judge, Homologator, Calculator, Judge Panel, Chief Driver and Drivers.

The Tournament Organiser will invite the selected officials and:

- Shall be responsible for the cost of board and lodging of the Appointed Officials.
- Shall assist with transport
- Appoint personnel to fill ancillary positions. A list of names must be handed to the Chief Judge who is responsible for the selection and allocation of ancillary positions. It is the responsibility of the Tournament Organiser to ensure that there are enough officials to run the competition as a Standing List competition.

#### Homologation

The site installations for slalom and jump must have been checked to comply with minimum **Standing List Homologation** rating as per as section 9 – Homologation Levels.

### 15 OTHER CALENDAR COMPETITIONS

#### Chief Judge / Appointed Officials

The Tournament Committee will prepare a list of officials available officials. The Chief Judge shall be a rated a minimum of First Class Judge.

The Tournament Organiser will invite the officials and assist with transport and accommodation if required. It is the responsibility of the Tournament Organiser to ensure that there are enough officials to run the competition.

#### Homologation

The site installations for slalom and jump must have been checked to comply with minimum **Limited Standing List Homologation** rating as per as section 9 – Homologation Levels

## **SECTION 5 – GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **16 SOUTH AFRICAN WATER SKI TOURNAMENT COMPETITION LICENCES**

Skiers wishing to enter any South African Tournament Criteria Competition must be a member of the South African Water Ski federation and in possession of a current South African Water Ski competition licence.

#### **16.1 EXEMPTIONS**

None

#### **16.2 NEW LICENCES**

Licence application forms are available on request from South African Water Ski Federation Headquarters or can be downloaded from the South African Water Ski Federation Web pages

The cost of licences is contained on the current price list.

Licences will only be issued to current members of South African Water Ski Federation

It is wise to allow at least 2 weeks from the time of application for receipt of your licence. Note, however, that if you are not a current member of South African Water Ski your licence cannot be issued until your membership is paid.

#### **16.3 LICENCE RENEWALS**

At the beginning of every season, existing licence holders will be sent a renewal form that should be completed and returned to South African Tournament Criteria

No licence will be renewed if the current South African Water Ski Federation number is not given, or the correct fee not enclosed.

#### **16.4 FOREIGN SKIERS**

Foreign skiers who are entering more than one competition will be required to obtain a South African Water Ski Competition Licence

### **17 SOUTH AFRICAN STANDING LIST**

#### **17.1 COMPETITIONS QUALIFICATIONS**

All competitions sanctioned by the South African Tournament Criteria and run in accordance to these rules. (Standing List or Limited Standing List)

#### **17.2 PUBLICATION DATE**

30 June of each year.

## **SECTION 6 – OFFICIALS QUALIFICATIONS**

These rules are an addition to those published by the IWSF Region EAME. For regulations for other categories of Judges and Officials see International Water Ski Federation Region EAME Additional Rules - available on request from South African Water Ski Federation

**ALL OFFICIALS MUST BE CURRENT MEMBERS OF SOUTH AFRICAN WATER SKI FEDERATION**

**ALL QUALIFICATIONS ARE VALID FOR ONE YEAR ONLY AND SUBJECT TO RENEWAL.**

In order to be considered for renewal all officials are required to attend a seminar at least once every three years.

### **18 RULES FOR JUDGES**

#### **18.1 REGIONAL JUDGES**

**General:**

- ❖ Regional Judges can only be approved by the Technical Sub Committee of the Tournament Committee.
- ❖ All candidates for Regional Judge must be members of South African Water Ski and be aged 16 years and over.
- ❖ A Regional Judge may be qualified in two events.

**Functions:**

- ❖ A Regional Judge may function as a judge at Calendar Competitions, including the Ski League in the events in which he is qualified. He may not function as a judge at a National competition.
- ❖ A Regional Judge may not function as a Chief Judge at any Calendar competition.
- ❖ A Regional Judge may function as an Assistant Judge in an event in which they are unqualified as a Judge.

**Examinations:**

There shall be both theoretical and practical exams.

**Theoretical Examination - for qualification as Regional Judge**

This examination shall be a written exam supervised by a person appointed by the Technical Committee.

The examination will be on both the current IWSF Rule Book and South African Water Ski Tournament Additional Rules.

Prior to taking their exam, all candidates must have acted at two South African Water Ski Calendar competitions.

**Practical Examination - for qualification as Regional Judge**

A candidate must show he has practical experience in the event(s) in which he is taking the examination.

For Tricks a minimum of 6 runs of at least 2000 points. Half runs (i.e. passes) of not less than 1100 points may be used if necessary to validate the exam.

The exam may take place at any Calendar competition under the supervision of a person appointed by the Technical Committee.

**Renewal:**

A Regional Judge who fails to function to the satisfaction of the Technical Committee will cease to be a Judge.

## **18.2 THIRD CLASS JUDGES**

### **Responsibility:**

- ❖ Third Class Judges (3rd Class Judges are designated by, and on the responsibility of, South African Tournament Water Ski Criteria). They must be members of South African Water Ski and remain so in order to retain their qualification.
- ❖ All candidates for 3rd Class Judge must be aged 16 years or over.
- ❖ Prior to taking their exam, all candidates must have acted as Regional Judges at two South African Water Ski Calendar competitions.

### **Functions:**

3rd Class Judges are qualified to judge at Normal Homologation Competitions.

### **Examinations:**

South African Tournament Water Ski Criteria is responsible for organising and correcting examinations for candidates for nomination as 3rd Class (National) Judge.

The exam consists of two parts, one theoretical and one practical.

#### **Theoretical Examination**

The exam tests that the candidate has a basic knowledge of the Rules.

#### **Practical Examination**

The exam is a Tricks reading examination which must take place during the course of a single competition. The candidate shall write the Tricks runs of different competitors in the competition at which he takes the examination. He is not required to judge whether Tricks are performed according to the Rules or not.

Each of the following will be counted as one error:-

- ❖ omitting to write a Tricks performed by a competitor during the pass or immediately before or after the pass.
- ❖ writing a Tricks which was not performed by the competitor.
- ❖ writing a Tricks other than the Tricks the competitor performed.
- ❖ omitting to indicate that the skier starts in back position.
- ❖ omitting to indicate the end of the pass.

Only 20 second passes for which the official score (before disallowed Tricks) is 1500 points or more will be considered. Each such pass with zero or one error will be counted as a success. Each such pass with two or more errors will be counted as a failure.

The pass mark is achieving 12 successes before having 6 failures.

**Note:** candidates passing the theoretical examination only become a Regional Judge immediately. When they subsequently take and pass the practical examination they can become a Regional Judge or 3<sup>rd</sup> Class depending on their pass mark.

### **Renewal of Nominations**

The conditions of renewal of nominations as 3rd Class (National) Judges are the responsibility of South African Tournament Water Ski Criteria.

A 3rd Class Judge who fails to meet the minimum operating requirements may, at the discretion of the Technical Committee, be retained on the judges list as a Regional Judge for not less than one year, until the Technical Committee is satisfied that he is qualified to resume duties as a 3rd Class Judge.

## **18.3 SECOND CLASS JUDGES**

### **Responsibility:**

- ❖ Second Class Judges (2<sup>nd</sup> Class Judges) are designated by, and on the responsibility of the IWSF / EAME.

## **SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT ADDITIONAL RULES 2007**

- ❖ Prior to taking their exam, all candidates must have acted as Third Class Judges at four (4) South African Water Ski Calendar competitions.

### **Functions:**

**A 2nd Class Judge is qualified to function at Normal and Ranking List homologation competitions.**

### **Examinations:**

IWSF (region EAME) is responsible for organising and correcting examinations for candidates for nomination as 2<sup>nd</sup> Class Judge. The examination must be taken in the presence of the EAME designated representative in Africa (Louis Polomé).

The exam consists of two parts one theoretical and one practical. The examinations must be taken in the same season

#### **Theoretical Examination**

The examination tests that the candidate can master the application and interpretation of the rules to the level necessary to judge at Ranking List homologation competitions. The pass mark is 80%. The candidate is not allowed to refer to any rulebooks or notes

#### **Practical Examination**

The exam is a Tricks reading examination which must take place during the course of a single competition. The candidate shall write the Tricks runs of different competitors in the competition at which he takes the examination (or from an EAME TC approved video tape).

Each of the following will be counted as one error:-

- ❖ omitting to write a Tricks performed by a competitor during the pass or immediately before or after the pass.
- ❖ writing a Tricks which was not performed by the competitor.
- ❖ writing a Tricks other than the Tricks the competitor performed.
- ❖ omitting to indicate that the skier starts in back position.
- ❖ omitting to indicate the end of the pass.

Only 20 second passes for which the official score (before disallowed Tricks) is 2800 points or more will be considered. Each such pass with zero or one error will be counted as a success. Each such pass with two or more errors will be counted as a failure.

The pass mark is achieving 12 successes before having 6 failures.

### **Renewal of Nominations:**

A 2<sup>nd</sup> Class judge is expected to officiate at a least one sanction competition per year to retain his qualifications

## **18.4 FIRST CLASS JUDGES**

### **Responsibility:**

- ❖ First Class Judges (1<sup>st</sup> Class Judges) are designated by, and on the responsibility of the IWSF / EAME.
- ❖ The minimum age for a candidate is 21 years in the year of application unless ruled otherwise by the TC .
- ❖ Prior to taking their exam, all candidates must have acted as 2<sup>nd</sup> Class Judges at four (4) South African Water Ski Calendar competitions.

### **Functions:**

**A 1st Class Judge is qualified to function at any level of homologated competition.**

### **Examinations:**

IWSF (region EAME) is responsible for organising and correcting examinations for candidates for nomination as 1<sup>st</sup> Class Judge. The examination must be taken at IWSF / EAME designated competitions. Application for the examination of a candidate shall be made on the official form to the TC by the candidate's Federation

## **SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT ADDITIONAL RULES 2007**

The exam consists of two parts, one theoretical and one practical. The examinations must be taken in the same season

### **Theoretical Examination**

The examination tests that the candidate can master the application and interpretation of the rules to the level necessary to judge at Record Capability homologation competitions. The pass mark is 80%.

### **Practical Examination**

The exam is a Tricks reading examination which must take place during the course of a single competition. The candidate shall write the Tricks runs of different competitors in the competition at which he takes the examination (or from an EAME TC approved video tape).

Each of the following will be counted as one error:-

- ❖ omitting to write a Tricks performed by a competitor during the pass or immediately before or after the pass.
- ❖ writing a Tricks which was not performed by the competitor.
- ❖ writing a Tricks other than the Tricks the competitor performed.
- ❖ omitting to indicate that the skier starts in back position.
- ❖ omitting to indicate the end of the pass.

Only 20 second passes for which the official score (before disallowed Tricks) is 3500 points or more will be considered. Each such pass with zero or one error will be counted as a success. Each such pass with two or more errors will be counted as a failure.

The pass mark is achieving 12 successes before having 6 failures.

### **Renewal of Nominations:**

A 1<sup>st</sup> Class judge is expected to officiate at a least one sanction competition per year to retain his qualifications.

## **19 RULES FOR TOURNAMENT BOAT DRIVERS**

There shall be two categories of South African Tournament Boat Driver. All applicants must be aged over 18 years.

### **19.1 QUALIFICATIONS**

All applicants must be current members of South African Water Ski Federation.

Anyone appointed to drive at a South African Water Ski Calendar Competition must be in possession of at least a Regional qualification.

### **19.2 REGIONAL DRIVER**

Approval of application will be considered by South African Tournament Water Ski Technical Committee based on their knowledge of the applicant and reports of Chief Judge(s) from Calendar competitions. Multi-site experience will be taken into account.

In order to retain the qualification for the following year a Regional driver must drive satisfactorily in at least one Calendar Competition each year.

### **19.3 NATIONAL DRIVER**

Applicant must already hold a Regional Driver Qualification.

## **SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT ADDITIONAL RULES 2007**

The application will be considered by South African Tournament Water Ski Technical Committee based on their knowledge of the applicant and reports from competitions. Multi-site experience will be required and the applicant will be required to drive a National event at which an evaluation will be made before upgrading.

In order to retain the qualification for the following year a National Driver must drive satisfactorily in at least two Calendar Competitions each year.

## **20 RULES FOR HOMOLOGATORS**

### **20.1 NATIONAL HOMOLOGATORS**

#### **General**

National Homologators shall be examined and appointed by South African Tournament Water Ski Criteria. Candidates must have functioned as Assistant Homologator at a minimum of two homologated competitions. They must be members of South African Water Ski Federation and remain so in order to retain their qualification.

#### **Functions**

National Homologators are qualified to function as Homologators at Normal Homologation competitions.

#### **Examinations**

Exams will be carried out by an Homologator nominated by South African Tournament Water Ski Criteria. The exam will consist of two parts, one theoretical (written or oral) and one practical.

##### **Theoretical Examination**

The theoretical exam shall consist of questions testing the candidate's knowledge of the Rule book and Additional Rules in so far as they concern the technical installations and the work of the Homologator.

##### **Practical Examination**

For the practical exam, the candidate will be required to carry out a complete homologation of a competition under the supervision of the examining Homologator and demonstrate his/her ability to carry out this work alone.

#### **Renewals**

A National Homologator who fails to function to the satisfaction of the Tournament Technical Committee will cease to be a National Homologator.

## **21 RULES FOR CALCULATORS**

### **21.1 NATIONAL CALCULATORS**

#### **Responsibility**

National Calculators shall be examined and appointed by South African Tournament Water Ski Criteria. Candidates must have functioned as an assistant at a minimum of two National standard competitions. They must be members of South African Water Ski Federation and remain so in order to retain their qualification.

#### **Functions**

National Calculators are qualified to function at Normal homologation and, in exceptional circumstances, at Standings List homologation competitions. In the case where the Region EAME TC has been unable to appoint a full panel to an International Calendar competition organised by his Federation a National Calculator may be appointed to the panel by his Federation.

#### **Examinations**

Examinations will be carried out by a Calculator nominated by South African Tournament Water Ski Criteria.

## **SOUTH AFRICAN TOURNAMENT ADDITIONAL RULES 2007**

The exam will consist of two parts, one theoretical and one practical.

### **Theoretical Examination**

The theoretical exam shall consist of questions testing the candidate's knowledge of the Rule book and Region EAME Additional Rules in so far as they concern the duties of a Calculator and the memory for Tricks values.

### **Practical Examination**

For the practical exam the candidate will be required to calculate a complete competition under the supervision of the examining Calculator and demonstrate his/her ability to carry out this work alone.

### **Renewals**

A National Calculator who fails to function to the satisfaction of the Tournament Technical Committee will cease to be a National Calculator.

## **22 RULES FOR TECHNICAL OFFICERS**

**Technical Officer** is a new role introduced by South African Tournament Criteria specifically to ensure all the required Technical Installations for any competition are in place and in good working order.

During the competition, the TO is responsible to the Homologator and Chief Judge.

## SECTION 7 - DIRECTORY OF OFFICIALS

All officials must be current members of South African Water Ski Federation in order to officiate at competitions.
